

Dear Parishioners,

Merry Christmas!

As people of faith, today we celebrate the birth of Jesus Christ. Who is he? He is the only Son of God the Father who loves us. He is our light. He is our joy. He is the good news for us all. He inspires us to do what is good. He became one of us to show us the heart of his Father. He is our Savior. How lucky we are to have the Son of God Jesus Christ as part of our lives!

Since the First Sunday of Advent (Nov 27), we have been invited to get closer and experience the heart of the Father and of His Son Jesus Christ as we read together Matthew Kelley's book, Holy Moments. We were also invited to become aware of our own holy moments, which the Lord gives us every day. 


On behalf of Hector and myself, we want to wish all of you a very Blessed and Merry Christmas. May we let the Christ child lead us and may we always remain His disciples.


