Pastor's Note

Dear Friends,

I have some good news to share with you today.

First, fundraising for the new sound system is going well. As of today, we have received \$37,991.00. This is amazing! I have faith that we will be able to raise funds needed to install a new sound system for our beautiful church. Relying on the interaction and conversation I have had with you, I get the sense that we all know, understand, and want to do this for our church. We all want to hear the word of God clearly. We all want to attend and participate in Mass where we are able to hear every word and prayer appropriately. Another aspect of the project is that it is allowing us to work together and share our blessings for a common cause that will affect all of us in a good way. Please accept my heartfelt gratitude for your kind support and generosity.

Second, it is with great joy, admiration, and respect that I would like to share a few words with you about the wonderful ministry of the members of the **Mission Ladies** at our parish. This ministry started in 1972. One of things that they did was to make medicine patches for hospitals. In 1998, Dolores Scaletta joined the ministry. As soon as she joined the team, she became the leader. As a leader, she is in charge of buying all that is needed for their ministry such as ribbon, warn yarn, and doll bodies.

The Mission Ladies (currently 27 in number) get together every Wednesday from 9:00 AM to Noon. They meet at the Parish Center (Gallagher Room). They work year around, except for the month of December. This past year, they gave over 400 dolls to hospitals around the area like La Grange Hospital and Hinsdale Hospital. They also make lap robes and blankets for nursing homes. Their budget is \$ 400.

If you would like to support their ministry, please make a check payable to "St. Cletus Mission Ladies" and place it in the collection basket or mail it to the parish. They are an amazing group of women. Please feel free to join them at any time. If you do, you would be warmly welcome by Dolores who continues to be the leader since 1998. She is 94 years old. She has much energy and passion which she happily shares with everyone. Our parish is blessed with Dolores and all the members of the Mission Ladies. They all radiate joy, kindness, and love. Perhaps that is the reason why I enjoy visiting them from time to time. Enjoy some photos of them and their ministry that I share with you here.

This weekend is Annual Catholic Appeal Announcement Weekend. I have asked Fr. Dan Costello, Associate Pastor, to lead us in this important appeal. Please look for his guidance in our parish bulletin. Since we have done this before and with the leadership of Fr. Costello, I am confident that this process will go well. In advance, thank you for your generous contribution to the success of this appeal.

May we continue to place our hope in the Lord.

Sound System Updates

Dear Friends,

How often have you heard, thought, or said: "What did he say?" or "I didn't understand what was just said or read" when attending Mass?

We gather in church to celebrate the liturgy and to hear the word of God.

But as we all know, for the past couple years it has been increasingly difficult to understand what is being said inside our church at St. Cletus Parish. And it is becoming increasingly worse.

The simple explanation of the current situation is that the sound system that we have relied upon for so long has finally met its expiration date. Our sound equipment has outlived its expected longevity despite all efforts to keep it working. Complete failure could take place at any moment.

Major components have failed. Consequently, we have been limping along with borrowed components that are underperforming relative to our needs, do not have the power and are not capable of the necessary calibration to provide the clear sound that would allow us all to enjoy and hear the Word of God.

After a complete analysis of the needs that the sound and video systems require and after careful vetting of several proposals for a replacement system, we are raising the necessary funds to fulfill those needs.

We have begun to receive donations from members of the St. Cletus community toward achieving our goal. The expected cost of the new sound and video systems is \$110,000. As of this week we have raised \$37,999. Thank you to all those whose generous contributions have gotten us started.

As you can see in the graphic below, we have attained approximately 34% of the funds needed. A good start, but far from enough to acquire the remedy we so desperately need.

- 3. Blessed are the families who humbly receive life's gifts rather than grasp at power and possessions, for they will discover they have been given everything they need.
- 4. Blessed are the families who nurture a hunger and thirst for fairness so that others will know the justice of God's ways.
- 5. Blessed are families in which mercy is abundant and forgiveness is given freely so that God's mercy will be readily available to all.
- 6. Blessed are families who ground their lives in God and rise above the lures of temptation, for God will shine His face upon them.
- 7. Blessed are the families who create peace at home, at school, at work, in the community, and in the world, for they will be God's very own.
- 8. Blessed are the families who strengthen one another, encourage compassion, and desire to do good despite life's blows and setbacks, for they help bring about the Kingdom of God.
