Pastor's Note

"If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask for whatever you want, and it will be done for you. By this is my Father glorified, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples." John 15:7-8.

Note From Father Mike

"God is greater than our hearts and knows everything." (1 John 3:20b)

When we say God is omniscient, we mean it. He knows everything! Not that it should be a surprise to us who believe in God, but sometimes we act like we are going to be sneaky and hope that God doesn't see what we are doing, or, as if He won't hear us if we are lying or gossiping. Are you serious? There is nothing He doesn't know about us. There is nothing He doesn't know about what is happening in our families, or the country, or around the world somewhere on a remote island. HE KNOWS EVERYTHING!

Now, does that mean He is in complete control over us as individuals? Let's just say He isn't simply a puppeteer and we the puppets or toys. No. We are made in His image and likeness. We can believe that because He became one of us and not some other form of being. No. He became human. He chose to save humanity through a human being.

St. Anselm once taught us "God is greater than that which can be thought." In other words, anything we can dream of, He is not only larger in "size," but superior too. Think of some of the big things on earth – any of the seven wonders of the world, for instance. Go up to the top of Mt. Kilimanjaro and overlook what you see for miles around. God is greater. Go to the Hubble telescope and look out at the cosmos – stars, planets, meteors, comets, black holes, nebulae, supernovas, and more. As deep as you can go into space, God is greater. Even if you want to believe that all known things came to be at the explosion of ONE particle so wound up in kinetic energy, that particle was made. It didn't come into being on its own. So, all of the scientists who study the universe and search for its origin are in many ways really grasping at straws. But then, is God knowable to us? Absolutely!

It's one of the most amazing things in terms of our faith. The more we get to know Jesus, then we are getting to know God. Jesus tells us that He can only do what He sees the Father doing. So, then, getting to know Jesus is crucial. Realizing that we believe that He is truly human without ever sinning is not supposed to be something that is "nice" about Jesus. His stainless soul is meant to offer humanity hope for our own salvation and offers us the ability to repent so as to follow Him closer and closer. Is perfection attainable? God is perfect. But the Son of God died. Doesn't that make Him imperfect? Actually, it doesn't make him imperfect at all.

Death is simply part of God's rhythm for life. Everything that comes into existence will cease to exist someday. That goes for the universe and all that is in it now or will come into being. Stars and planets form every day, and every day, they die too. And then what happens? They drift through space, sometimes their remains collide with other debris from other matter. It amazes me that with as much as debris out there from those dead planets and stars, there are not more catastrophic incidents. But then, that is how God designed it all. VAST! All of that debris continues to scatter outward – never hitting any sort of barrier. In other words, God continues to allow such debris to exist.

In the case of human beings, we think that when someone dies, they are gone forever. God made us such that each of us would have a span of life individually by design -- some longer, some shorter. But that is what presses us to live. And as St. Paul says in the letter to the Corinthians, when our earthly dwelling is done, we have "a dwelling not made with hands, eternal in heaven." (2 Cor 5:1c) Even St. Paul, way back believed that we live on. After all, the dead do not dwell anywhere, but the living do. GOD KNOWS EVERYTHING!
